All NSW public schools were sent an email inviting them to participate in the Game Changer Challenge. The task was to create a 60 second video outlining what our students believed Ingleburn Public School in the future may look like. Mrs Bellenger and Miss Scocco assembled a team of students who then put in a lot of extra hours and work into creating a video. While it only goes for 60 seconds, it required lots of brainstorming, storyboarding, filming, editing, special effects added and voice overs to be completed.

The Ingleburn Informer is please to share that the team was successful in their application and are now taking part in the exclusive Game Changer 3 day workshop during Education Week focused on design thinking.

Information about the Challenge:

Based on a 60-second video application, 16 teams from public schools across NSW – eight from primary and eight from secondary – will be selected to take part in a three-day, intensive design-thinking workshop in Sydney.

The workshop includes teacher training in the use of design thinking as a teaching methodology and its application for school planning.

It will also include a team competition where schools will work under the guidance of industry professionals in fields as diverse as technology, creative design and foreign affairs to design the school of the future.

The challenge winner will be selected after a Shark Tank-style pitch to industry and education experts, including Department of Education Secretary Mark Scott.
